This Draft Indian Standard (Part 6) which is identical with ISO/IEC 27034-6:2016 'Information technology – Security techniques – Application Security — Part 6: Case Studies' issued by International Organization for Standardization (ISO) and International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) will be adopted by the Bureau of Indian Standards on the recommendations of the Information Systems Security and Biometrics Sectional Committee, and approval of the Electronics and Information Technology Division Council.

The text of ISO/IEC Standard may be approved as suitable for publication as an Indian Standard without deviations. Certain conventions are, however, not identical to those used in Indian Standards. Attention is particularly drawn to the following:

a) Wherever the words 'International Standard' appear referring to this standard, they should be read as 'Indian Standard'.

b) Comma (,) has been used as a decimal marker while in Indian Standards, the current practice is to use a point (.) as the decimal marker.

For the purpose of deciding whether a particular requirement of this standard is complied with, the final value, observed or calculated, expressing the result of a test or analysis, shall be rounded off in accordance with IS 2 : 1960 'Rules for rounding off numerical values (revised)'. The number of significant places retained in the rounded off value should be the same as that of the specified value in this standard.

Scope of ISO/IEC 27034-6:2016 is as follows:

“This document provides usage examples of ASCs for specific applications.

NOTE Herein specified ASCs are provided for explanation purposes only and the audience is encouraged to create their own ASCs to assure the application security.”
